


Friday Mass Schedule and Stations of the Cross: Each Friday during Lent beginning on February 26th we will have Stations of the Cross at 5:30 pm followed by Mass at 6:00 pm.

Lenten Regulations for Fast and Abstinence: Ash Wednesday and the Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Church from age 14 onwards.

Operation Rice Bowl – Catholic Relief Services (CRS): In the early Church, people who had little, fasted and gave the food or money they would have spent to buy it to those with even less than themselves. We are blessed to live in a country with abundant food and economic opportunities. Along with our daily prayers for the suffering people of the world, Operation Rice Bowl provides us with an opportunity to thank God for His blessings to us by helping His children who are in need.
