Parish Breakfast: We will have a Parish Breakfast today, Sunday March 9, after our 9:00 am Mass. Everyone is welcome.

Friday Mass Schedule and Stations of the Cross: Each Friday during Lent beginning on March 14th we will have Stations of the Cross at 5:30 pm followed by Mass at 6:00 pm. Our Eucharistic Adoration will move to Thursdays from 7:00 am – 8:00 am before Thursday Mass.

Lenten Regulations for Fast and Abstinence: Ash Wednesday and the Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. For members of the Roman Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Church from age 14 onwards.

Operation Rice Bowl – Catholic Relief Services (CRS):. In the early Church, people who had little, fasted and gave the food or money they would have spent to buy it to those with even less than themselves. We are blessed to live in a country with abundant food and economic opportunities. Along with our daily prayers for the suffering people of the world, Operation Rice Bowl provides us with an opportunity to thank God for His blessings by helping His children who are in need. Please pick up a Rice Bowl box in the narthex and add what you can to it during Lent.

Season of Lent: Ash Wednesday began the liturgical season of Lent. Lent is a forty-day time in which Catholics prepare through intense self-examination, penance, and prayer for the Easter Triduum. The Easter Triduum is the summit of the Liturgical Year and is from the evening of Holy Thursday to the evening of Easter Sunday. Though chronologically three days, they are liturgically one day unfolding for us the unity of Christ's Paschal Mystery. The single celebration of the Triduum marks the end of the Lenten season, and leads to the Mass of the Resurrection of the Lord at the Easter Vigil.
